Safety tips

- Store emergency numbers on your phone and make sure its
- Be careful of cellphone snatchers and pick pockets when
- the car. Always lock your belongings in the boot and out
- wallets on tables or on the floor, especially while sitting outside. Leave bags where you can see them.
- Avoid carrying all your valuables (including your passport)

- Be careful of car-jamming. Always check that the car doors
- Treat beggars with respect but firmly say "No, please leave me alone" if they become aggressive. Support a charity or shelter rather than give money to homeless people. Contact police or a public safety ambassador if you feel threatened. Do not feed wildlife and always maintain a safe distance
- from baboons they can be dangerous.
