COVID-19 TREATMENT GUIDELINES UPDATE (VERSION 3: 29 MARCH 2020)

THIS CIRCULAR IS A FOLLOW UP TO THE CIRCULAR H36/2020: COVID-19 TREATMENT GUIDELINES

A COVID-19 Ministerial Advisory Committee has been set up to deal with the COVID-19 pandemic. A sub-committee, which includes representation from National Department of Health (NDOH), National Essential Medicines List Committee (NEMLC), National Institute for Communicable Disease (NICD), private and public sector, etc., is looking at treatment guidelines. The guidelines are being dealt with as a matter of great urgency.

The sub-committee is aware that evidence is still emerging and thus, the guidelines will be updated on a regular basis, as appropriate.

referred to in the document and the latest NDOH Standard Treatment Guidelines and

To Note:

• There is at present no current published peer-reviewed evidence from randomised

controlled trials to recommend any specific medicine treatment for patients with

suspected or confirmed COVID-19 infections¹.

• There is no current convincing published peer-reviewed evidence to support the

use of any medicine or vaccine to prevent COVID-19 infection¹. Prevention consists

of non-pharmaceutical interventions, such as good hand hygiene, cough etiquette

and social distancing¹.
