1. Consensus approach



Approach

- The Western Cape and Eastern Cape DOHs have formally entered into a collaboration to jointly strengthen the health systems in the 2 provinces, and jointly implement a UHC/NHI model
- The overall goal of the collaboration is to develop a model for UHC/NHI implementation in a functional provincial public health system in Eastern and Western Cape in South Africa
- 3. The basic premise is that a functional provincial public health system is an essential pre-requisite for the successful implementation of a UHC/NHI model




Health System Strengthening (HSS) strategy

- 1. A HSS strategy is essential to continually increase the resilience of the provincial public health system to cope with existing and future shocks and challenges
- 2. The most critical element of the HSS strategy is a governance and leadership strategy focused on a strong decentralized district management system, with a strong strategic centre for support and alignment
- 3. An essential element of the HSS strategy is to **continuously improve the quality of the public health system services** rendered to the citizens, with a view of becoming the **health service provider of choice** for the citizens
- A prevention focused approach anchored in the life-course cycle for optimal population health outcomes, through a Community Oriented Primary Care (COPC) approach, within the context of a Whole of Society approach (WoSA)
- 5. A key element of the HSS strategy is the development of a strong and resilient Information System enabled by a robust IT system



Prevention focused within the life-course cycle



"Whole of Society" Wellness strategy, underpinned by on primary, secondary and tertiary prevention and addressing social determinants of health, localized in each defined geographic area



Implementation of the UHC/NHI model

- A critical appraisal of the contents of the NHI Bill has been conducted to reach a common understanding of the key concepts and the implications of these for a functional provincial public health system
- The implementation of the UHC/NHI model presents an ideal opportunity to strengthen the health system (HSS)
- The implementation of key elements of the NHI Bill will happen in the 4 subdistrict learning sites across the two provinces, within the context of the HSS strategy of the two provinces
- 4. A specific **detailed project plan** will be developed to **anchor the learning** site activities



2. Confirmed four learning sites



Learning Sites

- 1. Eastern Cape:
 - a) KSD sub-district in OR Tambo District (the district is already the National NHI pilot site)
 - b) Buffalo City Metro sub-district (urban sub-district with a good range of health facilities, including the new Cecilia Makiwane Hospital)
- 2. Western Cape:
 - a) Saldanha sub-district in the West Coast District (already a learning site for WoSA)
 - **b)** Klipfontein sub-district in the City of Cape Town District (urban subdistrict to become a WoSA learning site)



3. Progress to date



Progress to date

- 1. Formal engagement of Executive Management Teams:
 - a) Two joint meetings held (10th April & 19 July 2018)
 - b) Collaboration formalized and confirmation of one joint project team

2. Stake-holder strategy:

- a) National Department endorsement (NHC Tech)
- b) Private sector partners
- c) Social partners (Community engagement and Civil Society)
- d) Other partners (e.g. HEIs)

3. Information system/ IT system:

- a) Linkages with National HPRS
- b) Commitment to joint IM and IT system development

4. Learning sites:

- a) Confirmation of technical teams in each learning site
- b) Initial engagements with the teams



4. Next steps



Next Steps

1. Finalization of joint proposal:

- a) Joint technical team will finalize proposal by mid-August 2018 with NDOH involvement
- b) Formal tabling of proposal at NHC Tech by mid-August 2018

2. Stake-holder engagements:

- a) Systematic engagement with key stake-holders to be confirmed
- b) Community/ Civil Society engagements to be planned
