PATIENT FEE ASSESSMENT

THE INCOME BRACKETS FOR PATIENT FEE ASSESSMENT HAVE BEEN REVISED, EFFECTIVE 1 APRIL 2017.

Recipients of South African Social Grants (SASSA)

Formally unemployed

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Must provide written proof

Income less than R5 833 per month for a single unit (RO - <R70 000 p.a)

Income less than R8 333 per month for a family unit (R0 to <R100 000 p.a)



Income between R5 833 and R20 833 per month for a single unit (equal or >R70 000 but <R250 000 p.a)

Income between R8 333 and R29 166 per month for a family unit (equal or >R100 000 but <R350 000 p.a)

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A FAMILY UNIT is a married couple or a single person, widow/widower, divorcee WITH a dependant. A SINGLE UNIT is a single person, widow/widower, divorcee WITHOUT a dependant.

Income more than R20 833 per month for a single unit (equal or >R250 000 p.a)

Income more than R29 166 per month for a family unit (equal or >R350 000 p.a)



Patients are assessed according to their combined monthly gross income irrespective if they are married in or out of community of property.

In order to be correctly assessed the following documents must be presented at reception:

- South African ID, Passport or driver's licence
- Passport and VISA / Permit if Foreign National
- Proof of income
- Proof of residential address
- Letter issued by the Department of Labour of unemployment.
- Proof of South African Grants (SASSA).
- Medical Aid membership card
- Appointment card / referral letter

ALL PATIENTS ARE REQUIRED TO PAY UPFRONT AT RECEPTION FOR MEDICAL SERVICES. SPEAK TO THE RECEPTION / FEES OFFICE WITH REGARDS TO THE COSTS.
