FIRE SAFETY FOR INFORMAL SETTLEMENTS AND BACKYARD DWELLINGS



TIPS FOR WHEN A FIRE HAS STARTED

- Notify other residents
- Alert the fire department. Provide directions and landmarks
- If safe, carry out basic firefighting activities using bucket brigades, thick blankets or by collapsing dwellings
- Put on the most protective clothing owned (e.g., leather, overalls, thick cotton). Avoid synthetic materials like nylon
- **6** Evacuate. Do not come back for possessions
- Clear access routes to allow fire truck access.
- 6 Guide the fire department to the fire site
- Notify firefighters if flare-ups occur
- Protect firefighters and municipal authorities
- 6 If possible, try to see which direction the fire is moving in
- If your clothing catches fire: stop, drop to the ground, cover your face and roll around on the floor. This will smother the flames and save your life.
- 6 Keep fire hydrants clear. Help firefighters to locate them
- Assist other community members.
- 6 Obey any instructions from firefighters, police, or municipal officials
