Prevention	Outcome - Children, parents, caregivers, families, and communities are aware of services that will support them and enable behaviour change	 Prevention Services: Education, information and promotion programmes targeting children, parents, caregivers, families, schools and communities with a particular focus on: Strengthening resilience in children and families to prevent child abuse, neglect, exploitation, trafficking, gender-based violence and teenage pregnancy. Parental responsibilities and rights in terms of the Children's Act 38/2005, including but not limited to safety and protective behaviours. Evidence-based child development programmes including topics such as communication, safe choices, prevention of teenage pregnancies, problem solving and protective behaviour.
Early Intervention	Outcome - Reduction in number of at risk children and families entering the statutory system	 Farly Intervention Services: Safety and risk assessment of children. A range of programmes for children with risky behaviours including, but not limited to, programmes for children with exceptionally difficult to manage behaviours, adolescent development programmes; programmes addressing bullying and children living and working on the streets. Trauma-informed counselling services for families. Evidence-based psycho-social support programmes for children and families including but not limited to children with special needs and victims of abuse. Targeted parenting skills development programmes to prevent children from

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		entering into the child protection system through statutory interventions. - Temporary safe care programmes. - Recruitment and training of safety parents for children with special needs - Accredited training on specialised provisions of the Children's Act 38/2005, including but not limited to: o Mediation o Adoption o Safety and Risk Assessment o Child Trafficking o Report writing o Supervision - Services to unaccompanied Separated Minor Children
Statutory	Outcome - Services that comply with statutory requirements	 Statutory Services: Statutory services to children and families aligned to the provisions of the Children's Act 38 of 2005. Alternative supervision services e.g. foster care and temporary safe care. Rendering Cluster Foster Care Services to children in foster care (Supervision services and transitional care/support services/in-house programmes i.e psycho-social counselling). Rendering the full scope of National and Intercountry Adoptions (if accredited to do so) on all four levels of intervention
Re-unification	Outcome - Children in alternative care are returned to their families and /or communities of origin and have access to a network of aftercare support structures and services	Re-unification Services: - Transitional care support programmes for children in alternative care (exit/leaving programmes for children 16+). - After-care support programmes that assist children and families to maintain their level of reconnection with their families or communities of origin (family reunification services).
Supervision	Outcome - Social service professionals are supervised by an inhouse or external social work supervisor	Supervision Services: - Supervision services aligned to the Supervision Framework for the social work profession in South Africa.
