Ability to screen for risky substance use utilising evidence- based screening tools. Dedicated and adequately trained professional staff. Ability to conduct comprehensive assessments. Implementation of motivational interviewing and cognitive behavioural therapy skills. Implementation of brief interventions linked to a structured treatment programme. Referral to service users to alternative treatment and services if required. Implementation of group therapy skills, psychoeducation sessions, life skill orientated groups and family sessions. Implementation of training to caregivers. Appropriate and adequate recording of therapeutic intervention.

Registration as an inpatient treatment centre in terms of section 19 of the Prevention of and Treatment for Substance Abuse Act, 70 of 2008. Inpatient treatment services provided by a multidisciplinary team consisting of a social worker, professional nurse and other mental health practitioners registered with the relevant statutory bodies. Provision of inpatient treatment service within a biopsychosocial approach. Implementation of a structured treatment programme focusing on early recovery skills, relapse prevention and discharge planning. Implementation of a case management system Implementation of individual counselling, group therapy and family interventions. Adequate and appropriate recording of all therapeutic engagement with service users.

Ability to conduct comprehensive assessments and develop structured Individual Development Plans Implementation of motivational interviewing and cognitive behavioural therapy skills. Implementation of a case management system. Structured programme must include early recovery skill, relapse prevention and discharge planning. Individual, group and family therapy to form part of the structured treatment programme Implementation of group therapy skills, psychoeducation sessions, life skill orientated groups and family sessions. Treatment programme to be documented and structured. Referral to service users to alternative treatment and services if required. Implementation of group therapy skills, psychoeducation sessions, life skill orientated groups and family sessions. Availability of psychosocial support groups or referral to available support groups. Appropriate and adequate recording of therapeutic intervention. Linkage of service users to economic opportunities. Longitudinal tracking of service users after discharge.
