- Centres that offered 6 or more learning areas during the assessment period.
- Registered 10 or more candidates per learning area in 3 or more learning areas, the rest having at least 5 candidates registered per learning area.
- Turnout rate of 70% or more in all learning areas.
- Pass rates of 80% or more in 3 learning areas (minimum) and above 70% pass rates in the rest of the learning areas (to a maximum of 6 learning areas overall)
- Consistency in numbers registered from 2008 to 2010.
