#### MAKING OUR PROVINCE BETTER, TOGETHER.

Since 2009, the Western Cape Government has, in partnership with residents, made progress towards our long-term vision of a "highly skilled, innovation driven, resource efficient, connected, high opportunity society for all".

For any government to create conditions for sustained progress towards prosperity for all, requires three pre-conditions: The Rule of Law; a culture of accountability, (in which all members of society take their responsibilities seriously), and a capable state that undertakes its duties efficiently, honestly, and cost-effectively.

Over two terms we have made significant progress, worked hard to keep our promises, and made sure that every rand goes towards quality service delivery, especially for those in most need.

We have raised the quality of basic education and laid the foundation for a digital future for our children.

We have created jobs and opportunities for more citizens, and made it easier to invest and do business.

We have supported land reform like no other region, made more South Africans home owners through title deeds, and refined a game changing development model for well-located, affordable housing.
