#### Minister Alan Winde

Alan Winde has been a member of the Western Cape Provincial Legislature since 1999. During his first term, he served as Western Cape Provincial Finance Chairman and Executive Committee Member with the Democratic Party. Prior to being re-elected in April 2009, he served as the Chief Whip of the Official Opposition in the Western Cape, as DA Spokesperson on Environment and Planning and as Deputy DA Spokesperson on Economic Development and Tourism.

Prior to his first election to the legislature, he served as a councillor in the Outeniqua Rural Council and the South Cape District Council. Alan Winde also has experience as an entrepreneur, having started up a number of small businesses, as a director of a tour company, and as a business broker with Aldes Business Brokers, a South African Top 100 Company.

He became Minister of Finance, Economic Development and Tourism in May 2009, shortly after the DA won the Western Cape Province. After the Democratic Alliance retained the majority in the Western Cape during the 2014 elections, he was appointed Minister of Economic opportunities, which includes responsibility for economic development, tourism and agriculture. In his years in office, Minister Winde has initiated exciting new projects to increase the attractiveness of the Western Cape as an investment destination, and stimulate job-creating growth and establish the Western Cape as a centre of business excellence, where an efficient and corruption-free administration works together with an educated and healthy civil society to ensure better lives for all.

The Red Tape Reduction Unit (RTRU) has been established under the Department of Economic Development and Tourism. Since inception, RTRU has made a significant impact on businesses in the Western Cape through the implementation of several campaigns and projects. All of these projects have a consistent thread of cutting red tape, making it easier, cheaper and faster to do business in the Western Cape.

#### **Airport**

### Arriving by car from the N1

On the N1 towards Cape Town - Take the R27 Table View off-ramp Follow the road until you come to a robot at the corner of Boundary & Marine Drive Turn left towards the beachfront into Lagoon Gate Drive

Proceed along with Lagoon Gate Drive, around a circle and turn right into the underground parking of the hotel or, you can proceed to the front entrance to the hotel.

### Arriving by car from the N2 (Cape Town International Airport)

On the N2 towards Cape Town - Take the M5 Milnerton off-ramp/exit which leads onto Koeberg Road

Continue on Koeberg Road until you reach the robots at the corner of Koeberg and Boundary Road

Turn left at the robots into Boundary Road

At the next set of robots, proceed straight across and into Lagoon Gate Drive Proceed along with Lagoon Gate Drive, around a circle and proceed straight to the hotel's main entrance.

#### Arriving from the City Centre

From the City Centre take N1 towards Paarl - Take the Paarden Eiland/Table View R27 off-ramp/exit (This leads onto Marine Drive)

Follow Marine Drive until you get to the robots at Marine Drive and Boundary Road Turn left into Lagoon Gate Drive

Proceed along the road, around a circle and straight to the hotel's main entrance.

Chris Darroll is the founder and Chief Executive of business environment specialists, Small Business Project (SBP). Cleanest Municipality Award (2006 – 2007/2007 – 2008) and three consecutive clean audits (2010 – 2013). Several initiatives of Swartland Municipality are now regarded as best practice.



**Dr. Peter Bex** is Principal at and one of the founders of SIRA Consulting. SIRA Consulting focuses on policy development and implementation at all levels of government.
