## IMPORTANT ROAD SAFETY NOTICE:

Speeding and unroadworthy vehicles cost the Western Cape nearly 1 300 lives and R22 billion in economic damages each year. To help combat this scourge, Automatic Number Plate Recognition (ANPR) cameras are now active on major routes.

## THESE CAMERAS CAN DETECT:

- The average speed of a vehicle between two points;
- The registration status of a vehicle:
- The roadworthy status of a vehicle;
- Whether a vehicle has invalid or cloned number plates;
- Whether there are outstanding warrants of arrest associated with a vehicle; and
- Whether a vehicle has been reported stolen.



ANPR cameras **automatically** inform the nearest traffic office when speed transgressions are detected through the ASE system. Traffic officers will respond to the notification by **pulling over** the identified vehicle.


Average Speed Enforcement (ASE) systems are now active on 452 km of national roads and certain stretches of major highways in the Western Cape, namely:

- N1 from Beaufort West to Three Sisters
- N2 Somerset West

(Elandskloof point) to Steenbras

- N2 Steenbras to Houwhoek
- R61 from Beaufort West to Aberdeen
- R27 West Coast
