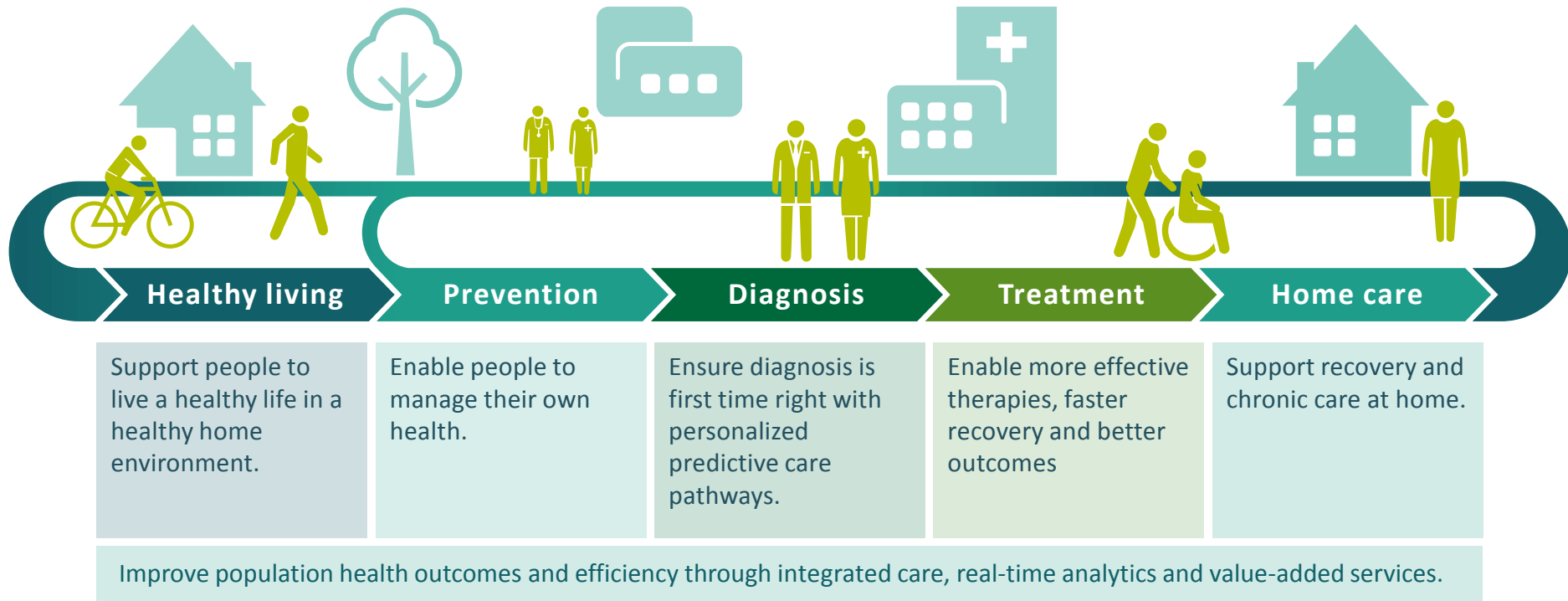

Philips examples of PPPs

Def: A **public–private partnership (PPP or 3P or P3)** is a government service or **private** business venture that is funded and operated through a **partnership** of government and one or more **private** sector companies.

- India PPP through an SPV
- Georgia 15 year contract
- Karolinska technology partner
- Kenya PPP through syndicated financing
- Zambia PPP through guarantees from sovereign funding
- KZN PPP through development finance

Working with government to strengthen health delivery systems- a nuanced form of PPPs

- Research and development – UNICEF, UN Foundation, Kiambu County Government in Kenya , Government of Senegal on adolescent health
- Optimizing workflow for perinatal care in Tygerberg hospital in CapeTown
- Equipping ambulances and investing in education with Simulation labs in University of Johannesburg
- Collaboration with National Health in project Phakisa aimed at strengthening the Primary health system in RSA
 - Ideal clinic initial discussions – now seeking to scale up the infrastructure filling gap in three provinces
- Large scale project for revitalization of 71 hospitals in Zambia
- Strengthening referral network for mother and child care in three districts in Mozambique
- Enhancing Mother & Child care in Namibia
