LABOUR MARKET INTELLIGENCE RESEARCH PROGRAMME (LMIP): BACKGROUND

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Introduction

- Launched by the Minister in 2012
- Implemented in a 5-year cycle, with a midterm review
- Research undertaken by wide range of organisations commissioned through a central service provider
- 1st Phase commissioned through the Human Sciences Research Council
- 2nd Phase commissioned through the University of Cape Town ending in 2024/25
- 3rd Phase to begin in 2025/26
- LMIP is government-wide programme Outputs expected to be utilised across government
- Continue to collaborate with international organisations to keep abreast with international trends

Why LMIP?

LMI research undertaken to:

- Improve responsiveness of post-school education and training system to world of work – a demand driven E&T system
- Provide evidence about skills needs that can be used by all stakeholders
- Align skills planning with economic planning
- Ensure that skills not a constraint on economic growth
- Promote the use of labour market intelligence for skills provisioning

LMI research can be used to inform:

- Supply-side planning (enrolment planning) in education and training institutions
- Career guidance/advice
- Identifying priorities for funding
- Recruitment of skilled personnel from outside of South Africa
- Development of qualifications, programmes and curricula that are relevant to the needs of the labour market
- Inform Sector, Industry, regional and employer training plans

Key LMI research projects

- Report on Skills Supply and Demand Provide a broader economic context & a holistic picture on skills supply and demand, as well as imbalances
- National list of occupations in high demand support enrolment planning, career information, guide allocation of resources, qualifications, programme & curriculum development, international scholarships etc.
- Critical Skills List Inform the issuing of the Critical Skills Visa

New Projects:

- Human Resource Development Strategy of South Africa and its Master Skills Plan
- Skills needs for the Hydrogen Economy
- Provincial list of occupations in High Demand – piloted in two provinces (WC and MP)
- Identification of skills gaps in South Africa
