



- Robust market growth: Western Cape's agri-processing sector has grown by over 7.2% in terms of its GVA between 2019 - 2024, aligning with forecasted global annualised growth rate of 7.5% between 2024-2031.
- Top Global Wine Producer: South Africa ranks in the top 10 global destinations for the production of traditional wine. The major wine regions of SA are situated in the Western Cape, most notably the Cape Winelands, which has nearly 14,300 hectares dedicated to wine grape vineyards.
- Speed to Market Edge: The Western Cape's shipping of goods to the European region takes roughly 22 days, faster than Chile's Valparaíso corridor (≈25 days) and Australia's (≈42 days), keeping fruit firmer and reducing coldchain cost, a very important feature of the Western Cape's thriving citrus export market.

### **Established Global Sustainable Fishing Brand:**

Western Cape dominates South Africa's fishing exports, accounting for approximately 68% of the national total and growing at a CAGR of 7.7% between 2020 and 2024. The province is home to South Africa's deep-sea hake trawl fishery — the first in Africa and globally recognised as the world's first MSC-certified hake fishery. Western Cape waters are also home to the prized West Coast rock lobster, a native delicacy revered globally as a high-value luxury export.

Agri-focused Education Excellence: Stellenbosch University leads South Africa's tertiary institutions in agriculture & forestry graduates, and is a top 100 university globally, ranking 3rd in Africa, for overall academic excellence. It is also the only university which offers a degree in viticulture and oenology, and it has many of the country's most successful winemakers as alumni.


### **Climate Advantage and Advanced Trade**

Infrastructure: Western Cape's unique climate enables year-round food production, ensuring reliable exports as global demand grows 60% by 2050. Deepwater ports in Saldanha and Cape Town, with modern cold chain infrastructure, deliver fresh produce to Europe in under three weeks, minimising spoilage. Cape Town Intl. airport supports rising air cargo for high-value, time-sensitive goods. Local firms also benefit from zero-duty trade to 46 African states, cutting regional shipping costs by up to 15%.

Indigenous Botanicals Premium: Rooibos (the first African food with EU PDO status) ships 9 700 tons a year to 50 + markets, Honeybush already exports 200+ tons annually and is advancing its own Geographical Indication (GI) registration, while Buchu's aromatic leaf oils power high-margin nutraceutical sales, especially among European countries.
