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## The need and hunger for data

- Government has sought to underpin its projects with research and a deepened understanding of the environment.
- In simple terms, public sector decision-making has to be supported by empirical, measurable and accurate data.
- To achieve this in the event sector created the need for a reporting tool able to generate robust data.



## Tracking our progress

## Our point of departure...

- The BOX
- Inconsistency in reporting
- Politicians raised questions on validity of the findings
- Lack of alignment between reporting process and our strategic goals

#### Stemming from this...

A gap was identified for a more uniform approach that met both government's need for consistent reports and Event Organisers' need for accurate data

#### The strategic response...

Developed a partnership with CHEC with the explicit purpose of addressing that gap.



## **The Initiation Phase**

### Year 1: 2015

- Partnered with CHEC to develop a standardised set of indicators and a methodology to conduct impact assessments. The following products were developed:
  - Event Organiser Survey
  - Exhibitor/Stallholder Survey
  - Service Provider Survey
  - Sponsor Survey
- Piloted surveys with 5 of our Jewel Events

### Year 2: 2016

- CHEC developed an attendee survey and incubator survey to add to the methodology
- Piloted attendee survey at Knysna Oyster Festival and Two Oceans Marathon



### As we move to maturity ... 2017

Focus on rollout and expansion of products;

Stakeholder Workshops
Hosted 2 workshops to refine indicators

#### Masterclasses

Hosted 2 masterclasses on Environmental and Social indicators

#### Municipal Engagements

Engaged Eden, Cape Winelands and West Coast Districts

#### A small victory

 Agreement with DCAS and WESGRO to use incubator methodology as part of their reporting frameworks

#### Product that emerged from these processes is a comprehensive guide on conducting Impact Assessments



The goal remains "better data" through:

- Rollout of the Impact Assessment Manual
- Sector support in conducting a predetermined number of impact assessments
- Continued refinement of indicators based on industry feedback
- Maintain the Municipal Engagement process
