# ISSUANCE OF THE REVISED WESTERN CAPE BIDDING DOCUMENT 6.1 (I.E. WCBD 6.1) AS ALIGNED TO THE WESTERN CAPE GOVERNMENT'S INTERIM STRATEGY AS IT RELATES TO PREFERENTIAL PROCUREMENT

#### 1. PURPOSE

1.1 The purpose of this communique is to inform accounting officers and accounting authorities of the issuance of the revised WCBD 6.1 Preference Points Claim Form (hereto attached marked Annexure A) as a result of the invalidity of the Preferential Procurement Regulations, 2017 (PPPFR) and the Western Cape Government's (WCG) interim strategy as it relates to preferential procurement.

#### 2. BACKGROUND

- 2.1 On Wednesday, 16 February 2022, the Constitutional Court handed down judgment in the application for leave to appeal against a judgment and order of the Supreme Court of Appeal (SCA). This application was brought by the national Minister of Finance ("the Minister") against Afribusiness NPC and concerns the validity of PPPFR promulgated by the Minister on 20 January 2017, in terms of section 5 of the Preferential Procurement Policy Framework Act, 2000.
- 2.2 The SCA held that the Minister's promulgation of regulations 3(b) (to determine whether prequalification criteria are applicable to the tender as envisaged in regulation 4 to the tender), regulation 4 (prequalification criteria for preferential procurement) and regulation 9 (subcontracting as a condition of tender) of the PPPFR are unlawful.
- 2.3 Due to the interconnectedness of the regulations, the SCA declared the entire set of Regulations are invalid on the basis that the content of the Regulations exceeded the Minister's power on what could permissibly be regulated on in terms of section 5 of the Procurement Act and section 217 of the Constitution.
- 2.4 In response to the above, the Provincial Treasury issued Treasury Circular 7 of 2022 articulating the interim arrangements as approved by the Provincial Cabinet via Cabinet Minute 85/2022 for the WCG as it relates preferential procurement.
- 2.5 The said Circular communicated that the WCG will maintain the status quo as it relates to the application of the PPPFR in so far as the preference point system is concerned up until such time that as the Constitutional Court Clarifies the applicable date of the invalidity of said Regulations or new Regulations come into effect. This necessitated the revision of the WCBD 6.1 to align to the interim strategy so as to avoid confusion for procuring entities and bidders.

### 3. AMENDMENTS TO THE WESTERN CAPE BIDDING DOCUMENT 6.1 (I.E. WCBD 6.1)

3.1 The following amendments were made to the WCBD 6.1 as reflected in Table 1 hereunder:

- 3.2 Given that the empowerment impact assessments for procurement above R10 million will not be applied as the decision taken in the province to conclude empowerment impact assessments was in terms of sub-contracting requirements, departments and public entities are required to note that the below requirements are held in abeyance until the necessary clarity is received:
  - a) paragraph 2.4 and 2.6 of Treasury Circular 09 of 2021 (hereto attached as Annexure B); and
  - b) Annexure 3: Empowerment impact assessment guide issued via PT Circular 30 of 2021.
- 3.3 In terms of the Provincial Cabinet approved interim strategy, it must be noted that the revised WCBD 6.1 issued herewith **comes into effect for all bids issued after the date of issuance of this Circular** up until such time the exemption sought from the National Treasury in terms of Section 3 (c) of the Act becomes applicable where the claiming of points will become invalid up until the new Preferential Procurement Regulations are issued, when a revised WCBD 6.1 document will be issued.
- 3.4 Bids advertised with the previous version of the WCBD6.1 must be processed in terms of the document that was advertised with the bid.

#### 4. REQUEST

- 4.1 Accounting officers and accounting authorities must note the content of this Circular and communicate the requirements to officials under their control responsible for the functions depicted in this Circular.
- 4.2 Accounting officers and accounting authorities must note that the WCBD 6.1 issued via Treasury Circular 09/2021 is herewith replaced with the attached WCBD 6.1 Preference Points Claim Form.
- 4.3 Accounting officers to note that the attached WCBD 6.1 is only applicable in terms of the cabinet endorsed interim arrangements post the Constitutional Court judgement on 16 February 2022 and will be reconsidered once the Constitutional Court provides clarity on the suspension of validity of the 2017 regulations as determined by the High Court. Once clarity is received the Provincial Treasury will reconsider and revise the attached WCBD6.1 further.
- 4.4 Accounting Officer's to note that once the new regulations have not been issued the Provincial Treasury will similarly revise the attached WCBD 6.1 in alignment to the new regulations.
