2. **REVIEW2001/02**

Communication services were expanded and a visitors' centre established. The launch of the Western Cape Provincial Parliament Website provided the impetus for public involvement in Parliament's activities. Advances were made in the translation of House documents in all three official languages. The upgrading of office accommodationandinterpretingfacilities in the House and Committee rooms has been completed.

3. **OUTLOOKFOR2002/03**

The promotion of public participation in parliamentary activities remains a priority for 2002/03 and to this end outreach programmes for communities and the youth will be developed. To augment this initiative the Western Cape Provincial Parliament will develop a portal on its Website aimed at youth involvement. The enhancement of service delivery will be addressed in 2002/03 with the review of policies and practices. In this regard Parliament will also implement its ownprocurement policy in 2002/03.
