

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Excitement is mounting as the first ever International Board on Books for Young People (IBBY) Congress in Africa draws closer. The top international conference on children's literature is coming to town! To describe the planned activities as a circus might seem over the top. Perhaps three rings, with their paper-making connection? Or onion rings, bringing tears (of happiness) to our eyes?

The 29th IBBY World Congress seems to have at least three circles of activity. In the middle is the congress itself with about 400 delegates from over sixty countries, enjoying three full days of conference at the Baxter Theatre Centre with a number of

social events. During the opening, the Hans Christian Andersen Awards for 2004 will be presented to author Martin Waddell (Ireland) and illustrator Max Velthuijs (Netherlands). (See page 38.) Around them in the Western Cape is a ring of fringe activities: many exhibitions of children's books, a pre-Congress SCBWI conference for writers and illustrators, a post-Congress symposium on *Humour in children's books*, happenings at many local libraries and a projected children's literature quiz. Circling them all is South African Children's Book Week - 6 to 11 September - in which primary schools all over the country will be invited to link their school to the IBBY Congress by participating in suggested book-related activities through an activity kit distributed by the Department of Education. Public libraries can take part too!

The children of South Africa will be involved (and performing) in all three rings. There will be young 'Book Bokkies' guiding and helping at the Baxter. All entertainment will be provided by young people: steel bands, choirs, marimbas, swing 'n all that jazz! An outreach programme is planned to take our international visitors into local



schools and libraries - we hope for sponsorship here. At ten to ten on Tuesday (7 September) Gcina Mhlophe will tell a story to all the IBBY delegates: we offer this as a universal storytelling moment when thousands of children all over South Africa are being told or read a story at that same moment. What a wonderful (free) declaration of belief in the power of story, springing from the oral tradition of Africa! Make sure that your library is not silent on that morning!

Don't forget either that linked to this IBBY Congress has been a fundraising to give 'Book flood' libraries to needy schools. Each contains about 300 new books, in the languages most needed by the school concerned, worth around R6 000. So far 18 such libraries have been delivered; we have funds for at least 25 more this year; and at least another 30 in 2005. In South Africa, IBBY does not merely talk books, it delivers.

IBBY is the world body on children's books. South Africa, through the South African Children's Book Forum (SACBF), has been a member since 1992.
