Linked to the fiftieth anniversary of The Freedom Charter accepted by the People's Congress in Kliptown in Soweto in 1955 this was indeed a fitting celebration. More about this on page 5.

Gebeure gedurende die afgelope paar weke het weereens getoon dat van 'stof is ons en tot stof sal ons terugkeer'. Ten tye van hierdie skrywe het ek net klaar na die begrafnis van Pous Johannes Paulus II gekyk - indrukwekkend en tog treffend in sy eenvoud! Wat my werklik geraak het, is die wyse waarop mense van alle geloofsoortuigings onder die son hande gevat en hul respek betoon het teenoor 'n groot gees - nie net in die toewyding aan sy geloof nie, maar sy strewe na menslikheid onder alle nasies - ongeag van godsdiensoortuigings, ras of kultuur. Terug by die huis het ons Nasionale Biblioteekweek gevier - 'n week deurspek met opwindende gebeure waartydens biblioteekpersoneel en Vriende van die Biblioteek baie moeite gedoen het om vanjaar se leuse, *Leer Lees Presteer* te bemark. Hierdie leuse het aangesluit by die nasionale projek wat onderskryf is met die leuse, *Maak die deure van opvoeding en kultuur oop vir almal*. Gedagtig aan vanjaar se vyftigste herdenking van die Vryheidsmanifes (Freedom Charter) wat in 1955 deur die People's Congress in Kliptown, Soweto aanvaar is, was hierdie inderdaad 'n toepaslike viering. Biblioteke is inderdaad huise van kennis - nie net voorsien hierdie instansies 'n skat van inligting aan almal wat daarvoor vra nie, maar is hulle ook deesdae op die voorfront van projekte soos Biblioteek Besigheidshoekies - waar hulle belangrike steun verleen aan klein, medium en mikro besighede.
