EDITORIAL

A notable event has occurred since my last editorial - we have had a successful and well-attended launch at which the Minister of Cultural Affairs, Sport and Recreation, Western Cape, Mr Philip Jacobs did the honours. Bridgetown Library (City of Cape Town) proved to be gracious hosts and the launch set the scene for what has turned out to be one of the most popular Library Weeks in recent years in the Western Cape. Libraries all too often don't receive the recognition they deserve. One way of putting your library on the map so to speak is to follow in the footsteps of the Southern Peninsula Administration's Public Relations Advocacy and Outreach Group and produce a video to promote your library to all and sundry - ranging from town and city councilors to the community at large. On page 35 Anne Baitz furnishes some guidelines.

There probably is not a newspaper, magazine, radio or television station that will not at some stage or other this year, feature that great composer, Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart. It is two hundred and fifty years since his birth. He is widely acknowledged as a brilliant composer who in his short lifetime produced some 626 pieces of music and the world is still agog, not only at his exceptional productivity but also at the sheer genius that characterises most of his work.

Not to be outdone by the rest of the media, the **CL** brings you a feast of articles, the first of which, *Amadeus Beloved of God*, (page 10) is the product of our correspondent Philip de Vos; a selection of his music as offered by our Central Reference Collection and compiled by Dalena le Roux on page 42; an overview of some Mozart-inspired documentaries compiled by Janine de Villiers (page 31); and finally, on page 40 an easy-to-produce display for librarians by graphic designer Monica Wagner. If you are one of the many millions of Mozart fans then this issue is for you.

Sedert my laaste redaksionele bydrae is die jaarlikse amptelike bekendstellingsfunksie van Biblioteekweek met groot sukses deur Bridgetown Biblioteek (Kaapstad Biblioteke) aangebied. Gaste is vereer met die teenwoordigheid van die Minister van Kultuursake, Sport en Ontspanning in die Wes-Kaap, Mnr Philip Jacobs, wat as gasspreker opgetree het. Die funksie was net die voorloper van een van die mees populêre Biblioteekweek-veldtogte in die afgelope paar jaar. Meer hieroor op bladsy 5.

Vandag nog is die wêreld sprakeloos, nie net oor sy verstormende produktiwiteit nie, maar ook sy ongelooflike talent.

Die **KB** laat beslis nie op hom wag nie en 'n leesstoffees wag op ons lesers, beginnende met korrespondent Philip de Vos se *Amadeus Geliefde van God*, op bladsy 10; 'n keur van sy musiek aangebied deur Dalena le Roux, Sentrale Naslaan Versameling (bladsy 42); 'n oorsig van Mozart-geïnspireerde dokumentêre video's op bladsy 31 saamgestel deur Janine de Villiers; en ten slotte, op bladsy 40, 'n maklike uitstalling vir bibliotekaris se deur ons grafiese kunstenaar, Monica Wagner. So, indien u een van die miljoene aanhangers van Mozart is, duik onmiddellik in die tydskrif in!
