City Debt Management : Progress

- On-going facilitation of data clean-up of municipal accounts i.r.o properties devolved from National Government to Provincial Departments
 - R84 million concluded
 - R25.92 million concluded
 - R9.7 million payment by WCED on 29 February 2012
 - Further payment by WCED by 15 March 2012
- Compilation of record / database of municipal accounts WCED
 - Off-setting of debit balances with credit balances.
 - Splitting of municipal accounts between property and service charges.
 - Accounts previously settled in full with outstanding debit balances/raisings.
 - Split accounts with no debit raisings.
 - Accounts identified as not the responsibility of the Department
 - Accounts with missing information i.r.o. street addresses etc.
 - Installation of water management devices at 30 Schools



City Debt Management: Progress

- Dept of Health:
 - Finalised the compilation of a database of municipal accounts for health institutions
 - Appears all the current accounts were not settled timeously as at 31 January 2012, the Department investigating the increase in the amount in arrears after receiving the information on Friday, 17 February 2012.
 - Meeting between PT, City and Dept of Health next week to address the matter.
- Dept of Human Settlements:
 - Reconciliations in respect of the properties which were transferred to private owners and the off-setting of credit balances against debit balances were concluded.
 - Identified accounts which were not listed in the asset register of the Department in respect of property erf number, street address as well as new accounts which appeared on the listing for the Department.

Debt Overview

- The overall debt at the end of January 2012 records a balance of R48.99 million which has decreased by R391,644 from the balance of R49.39 million when compared to December 2012
- The aging of the debt in the current (0 60 days) and arrears (+60 days) categories amounts to R14 million (28.6 per cent) and R34.99 million (71.42 per cent) respectively
- The arrear category of the debt includes the annual property rates accounts that have not been paid by the Department of Transport and Public Works for selected municipalities. The delay in the non-payment of rates is due to the shortfall experienced by Department in terms of their conditional grant allocation for the financial year

(Saldanha Bay , Witzernberg, Drakenstein, Stellenbosch, TWK, Overstrand, George, Oudtshoorn)



Debt Challenges : Reporting

A number of ongoing challenges exists which hampers the resolution of accounts and payment of arrear balances and include the following:

- Accounts addressed to the incorrect department
- Invoices not posted to departments for timeous payment
- Incomplete Asset Register (s)
- Inaccuracy of information submitted : Government debt template is not aligned to the AD Appendix B input form
- Late submission of information (after the due date)
- Information submitted in the wrong format
- Some information still outstanding/unknown (e.g. property name, dept. occupying property, period for which debt is outstanding, etc)
- Contradictory information e.g. Same municipality confirmed that there is no debt outstanding but submitted invoices to suggest there is money owed to the municipality
- Rates and services billed on one account for provincial properties



Analysis of Split Accounts

Extract from PT Circular 12 of 2011 dated 3 March 2011 :

"Municipalities are requested to ensure that all municipal accounts which include both rates and services respectively are split by 1 July 2011 to facilitate the payment of rates and service charges by the respective departments. In terms of responsibility, the Department of Transport and Public Works is responsible for rates of all provincial properties while the service charges are the responsibility of the user department. "

- A survey was undertaken to determine how many municipalities have implemented split accounts in terms of rates and services charges in addition to the one-on-one engagements that were undertaken with municipalities during 2010 and 2011
- The municipalities who have not implemented split billings on all municipal accounts include the following:
 - Matzikama
 - Saldanha Bay
 - Swellendam
 - Beaufort West
 - ✤ Stellenbosch
 - ✤ Witzenberg
 - Mossel Bay
 - * Kannaland



Analysis of Split Accounts (continues)

Before 1 April 2008, the National Department of Public Works (DPW) was responsible for paying property rates on provincial and national properties

- With effect from 1 April 2008, the function of paying property rates on provincial properties has been the responsibility of the provincial public works departments that now own properties in their respective provinces
- Budgets for property rates have accordingly also moved to provinces.
- The Department of Cooperative Governance and Traditional Affairs, DPW and Presidency are working together in trying to resolve the matter of arrears
 - i. Vesting (ownership) of properties
 - ii. R293 townships
 - iii. RSA properties
 - iv. Public Service Infrastructure; and
 - v. Section 20 & 21 Schools

CONCLUSION

- The Provincial Treasury have been working on the Govt debt management initiative for quite some time and with a reasonable modicum of success, given the state of account and billing management and accuracy on both the municipal and departmental (national and provincial) side, as well as the state of asset and systems management and capabilities.
- A major part of the government related debt problem relates/related to all of these elements, eventually reflected as either incorrect billing or inappropriate payments or both (in majority of cases).
- □ The Provincial Treasury will continue to facilitate the monthly debt steering committee meetings to monitor the progress on undertakings between the Provincial Departments and the City of Cape Town in respect of the payment of arrear accounts, splitting of municipal accounts between service charges and property rates and on outstanding debt owed to the City of Cape Town.



CONCLUSION

- Attend to further engagements with non-metro municipalities. In addition, the progress and status in terms of the debt related to the non-metro municipalities will be reported at the scheduled monthly Ministerial debt meetings.
- □ A status of the debt templates will be done in terms of:
 - □ accuracy of the data (no manual amendments by PT)
 - Alignment of government debt data to the Appendix B Input form
 - □ Act 9 Towns and the implications for government departments
 - □ Splitting of accounts

The above-mentioned criteria will form the basis for future engagements with municipalities

Municipalities are encouraged to maintain the communication with national/provincial departments and to advise the PT of any further assistance as may be required
