AN IMPROVED PUBLIC TRANSPORT SYSTEM IN GEORGE

The implementation of the George Integrated Public Transport Network (GIPTN) has been a success in terms of ridership, quality of passenger service, and transformation of the public transport sector in the town.

The GIPTN is a partnership project between the Western Cape Government, the Municipality of George and the national government to establish a high-quality, scheduled bus service in George. Phase 1 of the Go George bus service began operating in December 2014 and three phases are currently in operation.

Key highlights of the GIPTN include the transformation and empowerment aspects of this flagship public transport improvement project. Services are provided by George Link, a 100% black-owned private company comprising former licensed taxi operators from George. In addition, the service is managed and staffed by people from the area who were previously active in the industry. The formalisation of public transport has provided structured employment and the financial stability of a regular income for people previously dependent on informal taxi industry jobs with a precarious income.

Phase 4 of the Go George will see the service double in size to reach 25 000 passenger trips per day and provide services to the Thembalethu and Parkdene areas. The GITPN will continue to provide the safe, reliable and scheduled service that people of George deserve.







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PRIORITY PROJECTS IN CAPE TOWN

Two major road improvement initiatives are in progress: the R487 million project to add a third lane to the N1 between Plattekloof Road and the Old Oak Interchange (to be completed early in 2019), and the R186 million project to add a third lane to the N2 between Borcherds Quarry Road and the R300 (to be completed in October 2017). Because the N1 and N2 are two of the Western Cape's busiest and most important roads, easing congestion and improving pedestrian safety are high priorities.

AFRIKAANS SUMMARY

Twee groot padverbeterings-inisiatiewe is tans aan die gang: die R487 miljoen-projek om 'n derde baan by die N1 tussen Plattekloofweg en die Old Oak-wisselaar te voeg (om vroeg in 2019 voltooi te word) en die R186 miljoen-projek om 'n derde baan by die N2 tussen Borcherds Quarryweg en die R300 te voeg (om in Oktober 2017 voltooi te word). Die N1 en N2 is twee van die Wes-Kaap se besigste en belangrikste paaie; dus is dit van uiterste belang om verkeersopeenhoping te verlig en die veiligheid van voetgangers te verbeter.
