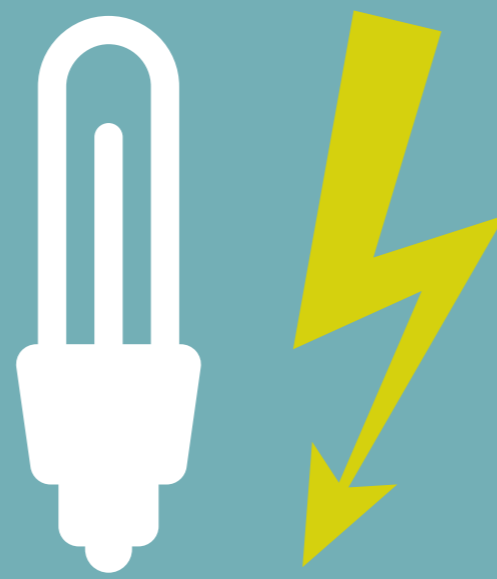


+R534m for skills development over the next 3 years

380 wi-fi hotspots for free public internet access

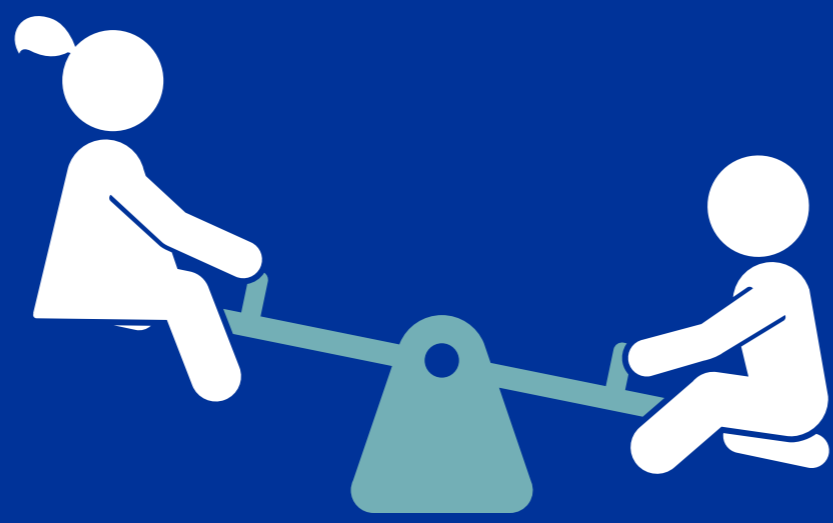

3 300 smart classrooms delivered as of April 2015

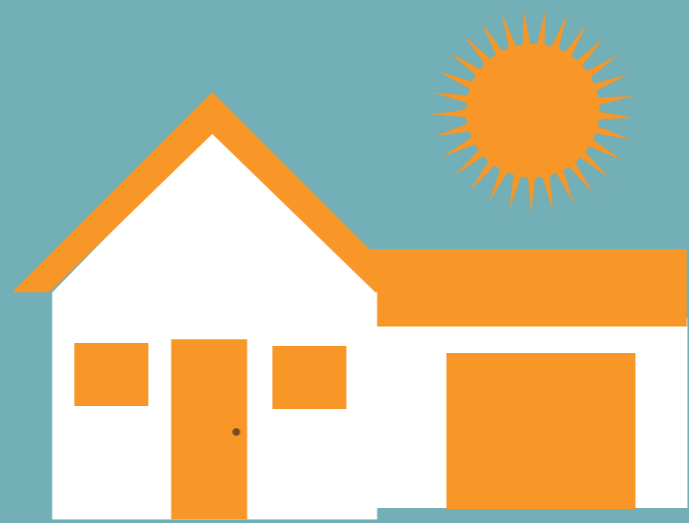
After schools
